



Issue Update

Infrastructure Projects to Benefit B.C. Communities

The federal and provincial government has announced 10 new community infrastructure projects located throughout British Columbia under the Canada-British Columbia Infrastructure Program. The total value of these projects will be close to \$4.7 million. They are as follows:

Cariboo

Prince George—replace existing outdated Prince George Snowmobile Club facility
\$80,000

Kootenay

Sparwood—construction to new community coal mining centre
\$2 Million

Lower Mainland

Burnaby—restoring and reconstructing heritage garden’s staircase, fence and trellis
\$171,000

Langley—build a four-lane overpass containing shoulders and a sidewalk at 204 Street that will carry over the railway lines and Highway 10
\$2 Million

Vancouver—installation of concrete footings, a shear wall and brackets, multiple steel restraints, and more to Burrard Street Bridge
\$2 Million

Vancouver—installation of elevator, replacement of stairwell and new washroom that is wheelchair accessible at the Christ Church Cathedral
\$538,000

Vancouver Island

Langford—replace existing timber-piling bridge with pre-cast concrete girder bridge at Goldstream Provincial Park
\$275,000

Victoria—build five bypass lanes for transit buses along Douglas Street
\$1.9 Million

Victoria—installation of elevator and fire sprinkler system at the Church of Our Lord
\$73,000

Victoria—seismic upgrading, acquisition, installation of improved electrical equipment and wiring for power distribution at the Victoria Theatre Guild and Dramatic School
\$310,000
