

BC CONSTRUCTION ASSOCIATION ANNOUNCES NEW BOARD CHAIR Anthony Minniti of CGI Constructors Steps Up To Lead

VICTORIA, BC October 14, 2022 – The British Columbia Construction Association (BCCA) has announced the election of Anthony Minniti to the role of Board Chair for the 2022-2023 term, effective immediately.

Based in Victoria BC, Anthony is the VP of Operations for CGI Constructor's Canadian Operations, where he leads a team of 100+ non-union and union staff across British Columbia, Alberta and Ontario.
