- 1 Introduce payment certainty legislation including prompt payment, lien reform, and adjudication processes. It's time for BC to join the rest of Canada.
- 2 Reinvigorate industry engagement in government-funded projects by fostering fair and transparent procurement practices and equitable contract terms.
- 3 Provide certainty in permitting at all levels: Continue to streamline prioritizing transparency and efficacy of the process while ensuring safety and regulatory compliance.
